Processing times for a Canadian visa can be long: be proactive!

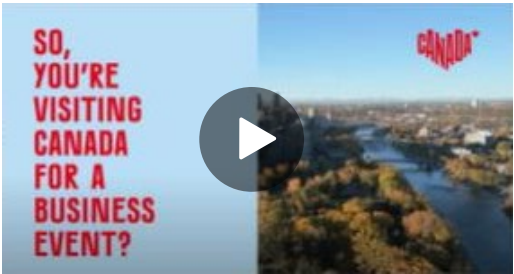
Visa processing times **vary depending on country of origin**. To guarantee your attendance at your business event, submit your visa application without delay. It is recommended to plan more time than announced to avoid any hitches.

- Check the processing times according to your country by selecting “**Temporary residence (visiting, studying, working),**” then “**Visitor visa (from outside Canada)**” as the application type.

Important: Before starting your application process, make sure you know your event code (available from the organizers).

Important: The form must be completed carefully—answer all the questions!



The visa application form is **demanding**. Every question must be answered with **care and precision**. A mistake, an oversight or incomplete information will delay the process and could lead to a refusal. Put together a **complete file** (supporting documents, personal information, travel details) to ensure things go smoothly.

Note that only Immigration, Refugees and Citizenship Canada (IRCC) and the Canada Border Services Agency (CBSA) can determine your admissibility to Canada. Make sure to travel with all the required documents.
